Moorestown School of Music Hosts a Family Ice Cream Social

Join us for a fun afternoon of music and ice cream.

On Saturday, September 12, from 3:00 – 5:00 p.m., Moorestown School of Music will kick off their new school year with an Ice Cream Social. Performances will be given by students and faculty, when they are not devouring ice cream. Headlining will be a Sing-A-Long led by our Music Together© instructors. Kids of all ages are encouraged to attend as this event is free and open to the public -the only requirement is a fondness for music and ice cream.

Moorestown School of Music has provided Suzuki music instruction in South Jersey since 1998. All of the students at Moorestown School of Music (from age 3 to adult) are taught their instruments by a faculty devoted to the "Suzuki method." The late Shinichi Suzuki developed this method and philosophy of music study, which he called the "Mother Tongue" method. Students learn first by ear, as with language. After some playing fluency is developed, the students learn to read music. Parents of children, who take Suzuki lessons, as with language, are very involved in lessons. They come to all lessons, play recordings of music for the children to listen to and assist with practicing. Students become confident in playing without music and tend to have a large repertoire of pieces they can play. Parents feel that the confidence developed in Suzuki music study flows into other areas of their children's lives.

Individual and group lessons are given in Cello, Piano and Violin. Music Together ©, a preschool music program for children age zero through 4 years, is offered 6 days a week. Musicianship, a creative theory and composition course, is also being offered this fall.
