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RECITALS HELD AT MOORESTOWN SCHOOL OF MUSIC

Violin, Piano and Cello students from Moorestown School of Music, *South Jersey's Suzuki School*, performed in six recitals recently in the Grand Room at the school. The students ranged in age from 4 to 17 years old. Parents, friends, and community members congratulated the performers at the receptions following the recitals. The next recitals will take place on Saturday May 10, 2008 in the afternoon at the Evergreens in Moorestown, NJ.

All of the students at Moorestown School of Music (from age 3 to adult) are taught their instruments by a faculty devoted to the "Suzuki method." The late Shinichi Suzuki developed this method and philosophy of music study, which he called the "Mother Tongue" method. Students learn first by ear, as with language. After some playing fluency is developed, the students learn to read music. Parents of children who take Suzuki lessons, as with language, are very involved in lessons. They come to all lessons, play recordings of music for the children to listen to and assist with practicing. Students become confident in playing without music and tend to have a large repertoire of pieces they can play. Parents feel that the confidence developed in Suzuki music study flows into other areas of their children's lives.
